

Y4 Reading Assessment

Decoder

I can read, on sight, all the words from the Year 3 & 4 spelling list

can recognise where words are an exception to the rule

I can recognise and understand an even greater variety of suffixes and prefixes

Comprehender

I can locate in formation using skimming, scanning and text marking

I can use a range of organisational features to locate information such as labels, diagrams and charts

I can identify features of a different non-fiction genres

I can compare, contrast and evaluate different non-fiction texts

Reading Detective

I can appreciate the bias in persuasive writing including articles and advertisements

can make predictions with evidence from the text and with knowledge of wider reading

can pull together clues from action, dialogue AND description to infer meaning

Language Lover

I can find and comment on examples of how authors express different moods, feelings and attitudes

I know how suspense is built up in the story, including the development of the plot

I can recognise the use the effect of patterned language in texts

Responder

I understand how the author wants the reader to respond

I can identify main ideas drawn from more than one paragraph and can summarise these

can identify themes and conventions in a wide range of books

Big Reader

I can make connections between books by the same author – Michael Morpurgo often starts his stores in the present but then goes back in time

I can make simple connections on how the reader's or writer's context makes a difference to the social, cultural or historical setting – 'The island sounds really dangerous to us because we have not heard of these creatures'

I can recognise some different forms of poetry

I can prepare poems and play scripts to read aloud and perform
