


Congratulations to Parks Class


Since 2009, The Primary Shakespeare Company (PSC) has been sending theatre practitioners into London primary schools, investigating and performing Shakespeare's plays and language with teachers and their pupils. Their experience illustrates the positive impact that sustainable artsbased education has on children - on their attainment across the whole curriculum (especially in literacy), confidence and attitude to learning.

Each year they choose a different Shakespeare play around which to centre their work, which spans a term and culminates in public performances during their Shakespeare Festivals. Every participating school is responsible for one act of the play. They send their team of theatre practitioners into each school to devise and rehearse. Class teachers attend insets and training sessions to enable them to use the play across the curriculum, principally in Literacy, Maths, Science, Art and D&T.

During the Summer term, Parks class participated in the competition and bagged a prize which was indeed a great achievement.

OPPORTUNITY FOR PARENTS AND CARERS

Due to Government Funding in the Adult Education Budget, Aim Group have several **free online Level 2 Accredited NVQ's** (OFSTED, CACHE, CQC) courses available to help adults better understand key areas around young people's wellbeing and neurodiversity while also upskilling professionally at the same time.

The following subjects are available, along with many others you may be interested in:

- Adverse Childhood Experiences Introduction into childhood struggles caused by events such as divorces, bereavements, domestic violence, etc.
- Safeguarding and Prevent Understanding your duty of prevent and increases awareness of online safety and safeguarding.
- Specific Learning Difficulties Understanding characteristics of ADHD, ADD, Dyslexia and Dyscalculia.
- Children and Young Peoples Mental Health Exploring children's mental health (identifying early signs, triggers and strategies of communication).
- Lean Organisation Management In-depth look the business environment and how to improve your management techniques.
- **Team Leading** Understanding the business environment and how best to effectively communicate and delegate.
- Mental Health First Aid and Advocacy in the Workplace Developing the skills and traits required to become a qualified mental health first aider.

The courses can last anywhere from 3-8 weeks and are completed on a self-study basis, meaning you are free to **make your own schedules** and can access your material online at any time. **You can do as many courses as you'd like**, however, you can only do one at a time.

Regarding eligibility, you must meet the following:

- Aged 19+
- Have lived in the UK/EU for a minimum of 3 years
- Not already on a government-funded course/apprenticeship

Please be advised to only enrol if genuinely interested. The courses are paid for via governments funds so it would classify as a waste of funding for an individual to be granted this funded and make no attempt at the course whatsoever with no reason. However, if you're approaching your deadline and need an extension, just let your online tutor know and you'll be granted an extension.

To claim your funding, please do secure your place via the funded link - <u>Harrow Funded Link</u>

School Meals & ParentPay

Please could we ask Parents and Carers to regularly monitor their child's ParentPay lunch money balance. It can take 3 to 5 days for a top up made by bank transfer to be visible on the account at the school; if it is your first payment by bank transfer, this can take up to 10 working days. Card top ups do not instantly show on the account, so please leave enough time for the payment to be processed so lunch can be easily obtained by students.

Your ParentPay school lunch account should always be kept in credit. Best practice is to top up at the start of the week. All EYFS & KS1 meals are free to parents/carers as part of the Governments Universal Free School Meal programme. If your child is in Key Stage 2 and you are on income support, your child may be entitled to free school meals, please enquire at the school office for further information or apply online using the link below: https://pps.lgfl.org.uk/

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
