

Dear Grange Community

We had 2 really valuable visits from our Parent Governors this week and it was so, so helpful to get their feedback. Here is an excerpt from my notes from the visit:

What is going well:

- Behaviour is very good
- All children are engaged
- Hardly hear any noise (even low level)
- Children are confident and speak respectfully even with people they are not familiar with such as a visitor to the school)
- Children display good manners
- Learning is good and extended - "not just the basic" (this was overhearing the lesson talk when popping in to classes)
- All children are busy in the whole class learning, not just the higher attaining children - everybody appears ready for learning and their contributions make sense
- When popping in to classes can see how focussed children are - often so busy with work, don't even notice visitors coming in
- Green corridor displays are beautiful, interesting and filled with children's work
- Beckham class and Parks class were filled with supportive to learning displays such as vocabulary choices and working walls

Comments from children to question 'what do you love about your school?' - "Love the learning; there is lots and lots of it." Another pupil: "All religions and cultures are celebrated for example Eid and this didn't happen in my last school".

Even Better If (room to develop)

- We need to ensure that all classes are filled with supportive displays e.g. Vocabulary prompts and working walls with models of work for learning from e.g. writing models.
- Corridor walls looked bare and there is a missed opportunity to share our messages and make the walls and corridors share the learning

I'm conscious of how hard staff are working so I will have to come up with a plan about how we make our corridor walls come alive but at Grange we always come up with a 'Polya' (that is a Grange word for problem solving).

We really welcome these wonderful visits from our Governors and there are more planned in the future.

Our Governors of Grange care deeply about the school and do all in their power to shape and hone the direction of the school to provide the very best provision for our children of Grange and the powerful progress and outcomes our children of Grange deserve and need for their lives ahead.

In the next 2 weeks, we will be building up to a joyous Christmas break with a visit from reindeers; Christmas jumper day; an interschool quiz; Christmas lunch and The very own Grange grotto for Santa!

Behind the scenes we will be holding a Governor committee meeting focussing on Teaching and Learning and I will be working on analysing data to present us with clear targets for the year ahead.

We have our Grange CC Way and we know that there is no substitute for each of us - we need to live our best lives so be great; BE GRANGE!

Boxing Club Trip to All Stars Boxing Gym



School Meals & ParentPay

Please could we ask Parents and Carers to regularly monitor their child's ParentPay lunch money balance. It can take 3 to 5 days for a top up made by bank transfer to be visible on the account at the school; if it is your first payment by bank transfer, this can take up to 10 working days. Card top ups do not instantly show on the account, so please leave enough time for the payment to be processed so lunch can be easily obtained by students.

Your ParentPay school lunch account should always be kept in credit. Best practice is to top up at the start of the week. All EYFS & KS1 meals are free to parents/carers as part of the Governments Universal Free School Meal programme. If your child is in Key Stage 2 and you are on income support, your child may be entitled to free school meals, please enquire at the school office for further information or apply online using the link below:
