Please do not drive in through the main gate to collect your child. We've had parents driving onto the school grounds to collect their child and then driving out in amongst pedestrians walking out. This is a huge risk to our children as they use the main driveway to enter and exit school. We've had parents parking in neighbours' driveways and parents parking on the zigzag lines outside the main entrance. We have to be mindful and respectful of our community and courteous to other drivers. The zig zag lines are there to keep all our children and staff safe. If there was the need for an ambulance or fire engine to come into school, they would be hampered by illegal parking! We've had incidents of cars speeding away right outside the gates which is putting our children in huge danger. PLEASE DO NOT DO THIS!

A traffic warden was on Welbeck Road after school on Wednesday and issued 4 tickets for illegal parking (I spoke with him and he was very friendly and had our children in mind). He is doing it to keep our children and community safe so please ensure you drive and park respectfully and safely before and after school.
