Dear Grange Community,

We are nearing the end of the 1st half-term of the academic year 2022-2023.

I have been reflecting and considering what we have achieved so far this year.

This is a key part of my job as Headteacher and I report regularly to the school governors so that they feel confident and secure that the school is well on track.

So, here are some of my reflections:

Ensuring that our curriculum is rich, broad and focussed to enable children to gain the knowledge and skills that they need to succeed:

We have appointed subject leaders for each are of the curriculum and each of these leaders is linked with a senior leadership supervisor. This ensures that they can work in a supportive partnership to plan the overview of the curriculum and enable teachers to have what they need to teach well.

This is well in place and over the next few days, you should be able to see the curriculum overviews for each year and every subject so that at every level, the curriculum is clear and useful.

Today I looked at the Spanish overview and it is so clear and inspiring. I am happy to say that I have joined the Grange Spanish department teaching team and am teaching Spanish in year 5 this year.

Please do look out for these curriculum overviews and give your feedback to me.

Ensuring ambitious outcomes:

We have been poring over data from the last academic year to set ambitious targets for each child based on their prior attainment and academic potential as judged by the teachers.

This has been reported to governors and we are blessed with a data expert chair of governors who is adept at debating, discussing and collaborating with our team to ensure that our targets are aspirational and ambitious for each child of Grange

Ensuring inclusion is at the heart of our school:

Inclusion is not easy because by definition it means to include the children who find it the most difficult to fit into the conventional teaching framework of a school. At Grange we are blessed with an inclusion department that is devoted to finding a way to include every child as far as is absolutely possible within realms of safety. We conduct regular 'team around child' meetings to plan for children who have specific and special levels of need.

We never give up and it is truly wonderful to celebrate each day that goes well for a child who is struggling.

We also work together to support each other when the days don't go as well as they could, yet because we know everything keeps improving at Grange.

A highlight of my day is how many children greet me with a CC salute and state proudly: "Be great; be Grange!"

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Step 4: Choose Teacher

Select your child's class teacher/s. A green tick indicates they are selected. To de-select, click on their name again.

If you have more than one child at Grange, all of their teachers will appear. Please select <u>all of the teachers to book appointments with</u>. It will make booking your time slots easier (see Step 5).

Step 5: Book Appointments

Click any of the green cells to make an appointment. Blue cells signal where you already have an appointment. Grey cells are unavailable. To change an appointment, delete the original by hovering over the blue box and clicking *Delete*. Then choose an alternate time. If you only have one child at Grange, you will only see one column.

You can leave a message for the teacher to say what you'd like to discuss, or raise anything beforehand.

Once you are finished booking your appointment(s), at the top of the page in the alert box, press *click here* to finish the booking process.

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Step 6: Finished

All your bookings now appear on the *My Bookings* page. An email confirmation will be sent to your email address. Click *Subscribe to Calendar* to add these and any future bookings to your calendar. To change your appointments, click on *Amend Bookings*.

All appointments will be face-to-face this year. Years 1, 2 and 3 will be in the KS1 hall. Years 4, 5 and 6 will be in the KS2 hall. Nursery and Reception will be held in the EYFS classes.

SPELLING SHED


As mentioned in the meet the teacher sessions, this year we are having a particular focus on spelling.

To support children with improving spelling, we have invested in a new resource called **Spelling Shed**. Your child should receive their login details this week. If they do not, please speak to your child's class teacher.

Each week, all children will have a spelling lesson in school where they learn a new spelling rule. They will then be expected to practise their spellings at home using their spelling book and Spelling Shed. They will have a weekly spelling test. You will be able to see how they are doing by viewing their results on Spelling Shed and seeing their weekly tests in their spelling book.

YEAR 3 & 4 MULTIPLICATION TABLES CHECK (MTC) PARENTS WORKSHOP

We would like to invite you to a Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) workshop for parents and carers on Tuesday 18th October at 8:45am until 9:15am.

The workshop will give you an overview of the Multiplication Tables Check tests that are compulsory for all Year 4 children in England. The children will complete the check in June 2023. We will also share information about how children from Year 3 will prepare for the tests in 2024 and the classroom routines that are already in place to support children's understanding of their times tables.

The workshop will give you an opportunity to complete a test and show you how the children will complete it. Most importantly, it will provide you with ideas on how to support your child in learning their times tables up to 12x12.

If you would like to attend the workshop next week, please wait either on the playground (Furness Road side) or just outside the main office (Welbeck Road side) straight after drop off on Tuesday morning. A member of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) will then walk you to the KS2 hall where the workshop will take place.



School uniform consists of:

- •Grey or black trousers, skirt or pinafore can be worn <u>with</u> grey, black or white socks, tights or leggings to the ankle (leggings are not allowed by themselves).
- •Grey or black shorts or skirt with grey, black or white socks, tights or leggings.
- •White shirt, blouse or polo shirt (with or without logo).
- •Blue check dress with grey, black or white socks, tights or leggings (no other colours or patterns).
- •Blue Grange Logo Cardigan or Jumper.
- •Black, white or blue headscarf with no embellishments.
- •Black leather shoes or completely black trainers (no white soles or logos).

<u>Please remember to mark all uniform with your child's name</u>

Headscarves

We work in partnership with all members of our community and we foster a spirit of mutual respect and understanding for religious and cultural beliefs. We therefore request that when headscarves are worn they are black, white or blue with no embellishments and are of a length that does not present a health and safety risk. Please remember that the children will be participating in physical activities involving a range of apparatus and equipment.

PE Uniform

PE (Physical Education) is an important part of the National Curriculum, and it requires appropriate clothing. The children should bring their PE kit to school in a separate, named drawstring bag. The necessary clothing and footwear are:

•White T-Shirt

- •Dark blue or black sports shorts/track suit bottoms
- •Sports trainers/plimsolls for outdoor PE
- •Plimsolls for indoor PE
- •Dark blue track suit or jumper and leggings for cold weather



Dance and gymnastics are done in bare feet; long hair must be tied back. Please ensure all items of clothing are clearly named.

POLIO VACCINE

Protect your child from polio.

Children aged 1 to 9 years old in London are being offered a dose of

polio vaccine.

Most children aged one to nine need to receive the **polio** vaccination to keep them safe from its devastating effects. Whilst it is urgent for your child to have the polio vaccination now, it is also important to check your child is up to date with their **covid**, **flu and MMR** immunisations as we enter the winter period.

Lots of half-term appointments are available through local pharmacies, walk-ins centres (no appointment needed) and booked appointments. You can find all the details of places to get your child's polio vaccination here <u>www.nwlondonics.nhs.uk/</u><u>polio</u>

Please check with the school about arrangements for the nasal flu vaccine in school.

Why is the polio booster so important?

Polio can result in life-long paralysis and other disabilities, and in extreme cases, even death. There is no cure for polio, immunisation is the only protection.

The additional booster vaccination for all children aged one to nine is being provided in response to the alarming findings that the poliovirus has been found in sewage samples taken in London. It provides the best possible protection, and the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) have instructed that most children aged 1 to 9 in London should urgently get a booster dose to ensure they are fully protected.

We have not seen a live case of polio in the UK since 1984, and it is vital that we prevent any community spread.
