Mr Kerbel's Compass

In the same way that there is physical geography, which is the wonderful study of where everything is located and how it plays its part in our natural world, there is also spiritual geography.

Spiritual Geography is about locating one's purpose and meaning in life and living according to these critical values.

Here in Britain we are asked to focus on the British values (which we regard as human values at Grange but feel proud as British citizens to be upholding) of:

Liberty: The right for each of us to live our lives as we choose and to be our true selves (Confidence)

Law: The clarity to know that as much as we have rights for ourselves, we have to live in a way that protects the rights of others around us (Consideration)

Democracy: That we sort out problems and differing views in a democratic way (The balance of Confidence and Consideration) through discussing and voting and reaching consensus

Respect: That we do not just tolerate but actively respect each other's communities and cultures in our actions and in our speech and in our approach to each other

Each of us needs to clarify our own values in our roles in life. For myself as Headteacher, I need to be thinking about what is really important for me to bring to our school and how to enable everyone to be their best and achieve the best outcomes for our school. I need to reflect deeply as if I were looking through a microscope to really get to the essence of what is important for our pupils and Staff of Grange. There are basic things that cannot be ignored: We need to ensure that everyone is safe in our school; that health and hygiene is maintained to the highest standard but that is just the foundation and much, much more is required.

Our children of Grange need to learn. They need to learn to be literate and numerate and to have scientific knowledge such as the difference between permeable and impermeable objects BUT if I use my metaphorical microscope, if I use my moral compass to point me in the direction of what is needed, I see that the core learning we need for each of us at Grange is.... - the CC Way.

We need to build our children's powers of Confidence and Consideration. We need to recognise our amazing staff for all they are doing every day to plan and teach and assess and then plan for the next steps of learning. Our children of Grange are making great progress!

I have now been in formal education for 26 years and I have never experienced a school Staff that are working so hard in the last few weeks of the school year.

The Staff of Grange are truly wonderful. We push ourselves hard at Grange and as the Headteacher, I ask much from the Staff. Teaching and educating is not an easy job and the stakes are high because children get only one chance at education and it determines their future. Our Grange staff are ambassadors for the teaching profession. They want to do their best and they want to our children to thrive.

An example today was when one of our teacher's phoned in ill and with existing staff absence it was not easy to think of a suitable cover arrangement. At that moment members of our team pulled together and put 2 classes together and the children received an amazing provision of learning even though it was not from their regular teacher. The teamwork meant that this crisis became a big adventure and even though the children had fun, the quality of their learning corresponded to their regular learning.

From myself, I want to say - THANK YOU GRANGE STAFF! WELL DONE GRANGE PUPILS. The end (of the year) is much more significant than the beginning and we are ending the year with the power of deep learning and our children are gaining the character strengths of Confidence and Consideration. Every bit of Grange learning is powerful fertilisation for the brilliant fruits of our children's futures.

SEACOLE: SHAKESPEARE REHEARSAL



Y5 LISTER & NIGHTINGALE: SHAKESPEARE PERFORMANCE






Hygiene: The way we care for our bodies. It includes many activities, such as washing hands, brushing teeth, and bathing.

Permeable: Having openings that let liquids or gases pass through.


Impermeable: Something that does not allow water or liquid to pass through it.



WHITE ROSE MATHS: 1-MINUTE MATHS APP

White Rose Maths: 1-minute maths







Who's it for?

This first version of the app is aimed at Key Stage 1 pupils, and focuses on adding and subtracting – and on 'Subitising'. They've also just added multiplication and division topics! The free mobile app is available for Apple/iOS, Android and Kindle.

How does it work?

1-Minute Maths offers children engaging and easily accessible practice in basic number. There's no specific route or starting point. Having chosen a topic, each user answers a series of randomly generated questions (a different set of questions every time means they learn the concept, not a sequence of answers).

When the one minute's up, the questions are automatically marked and presented on a breakdown screen, giving instant feedback on how they've done. If they're struggling with a question, a 'Hint' button reformats the question as a familiar manipulative display that mirrors the approaches used in the White Rose Maths schemes of learning.


