Key Vocabulary

Past - gone by in time and no longer existing

Present - existing or occurring now.

Old - belonging to the past; former.

New - already existing but seen, experienced, or acquired recently or now for the first time.

Compare - estimate, measure, or note the similarity or dissimilarity between.

Significant - sufficiently great or important to be worthy of attention; noteworthy.

Crimean war - was a military conflict fought from October 1853 to February 1856 in which Russia lost to an alliance of the Ottoman Empire, France,

Timeline - a graphical representation of a period of time, on which important events are marked.

Choronological order - arranged in or according to the order of time

Prejudice - preconceived opinion that is not based on reason or actual experience
