


# **EYFS Religious Education**

Year 1 has been learning and understanding different aspects of Islam and they now know how Muslims greet each other and what it means to be part of a Muslim family.








# Year 2 Religious Education








### Year 3 Religious Education






#### Year 4 Religious Education
